## Sexual harassment is never acceptable.

Sexual harassment isn't always what you might expect. It might be unwelcome touching, suggestive comments or jokes, sexualised nicknames, intruding into personal space or unwelcome personal questions and comments - in person or online. It doesn't matter who the person is or how small, hidden or innocent the behaviour may appear, sexual harassment should be reported every time it occurs.

You should report all sexual harassment to your manager, human resources team or WHS representative. If these internal processes fail, you can report your concerns to WorkSafe ACT and our psychosocial team will look into it. You can even report it anonymously. If someone sexually assaults you at work, you should call ACT Policing on 131 444, or 000 if it is an emergency.
